

CRITERIA TO ENTER OKLAHOMA RACETRACK

325:25-1-32

No Horse shall enter the premises of a racetrack without a negative test for Equine Infectious Anemia (EIA) conducted within the preceding twelve (12) months. A copy of the EIA test is satisfactory. The Organizational Licensee shall be the official in charge under OAC 35:15-15-91. The Trainer of the Horse is responsible for ensuring the EIA test result is in the racing secretary's office prior to racing. Failure to comply may subject the Licensee to disciplinary action.

Below are important updates for all Oklahoma Horseman transporting and racing horses at Remington Park.

a. A current health certificate issued within 30 days prior to arrival at the track which shows the vaccination record for each horse. The horse must have been vaccinated with an FDA approved modified live or killed virus vaccine for EHV-1 not less than 14 days and not more than 180 days prior to date of entry. The veterinarian must provide the date of vaccination, the brand, serial number and the expiration date of vaccine.

Testing for Equine Piroplasmiasis (OAC 35:15-18-3)

All racing Quarter Horses, Paints and Appaloosas entering Remington Park shall have proof of a negative Piroplasmiasis test (T.equi) within the past twelve (12) months.
